Foreword



Dear Colleagues, Partners, and Friends,

I am excited to share with you our key initiatives at Outward Bound Vietnam (OBV) for the second quarter of 2024!

Our outdoor adventure programmes continue to flourish, highlighted by our collaboration with United World College (UWC) for their summer course at our Binh Dinh basecamp. Read about their adventure experiences with OBV in this newsletter!

We witnessed leadership transitions at OBV's Governing Council (GC) and our Risk Management Committee (RMC) in June this year. Professor John Rickard has retired from his role as the Chair of our GC. I thank John for his guidance to OBV since 2015 and wish him a happy retirement! Ms. Debi Howarth has been appointed as OBV's new GC Chair. We also welcomed Dr. Clare Dallat as our new Chair of OBV's RMC. Hear more from them in this edition of our newsletter!

A key highlight in the last quarter was organizing a 3-day in-person GC meeting and strategic planning sessions in Vietnam. This provided an excellent opportunity for our Patrons, GC members and my senior management team to network, discuss issues and chart OBV's strategic priorities for the next 4 years. Our GC members are volunteer leaders who are experts from various fields from around the globe and I thank them for making the trip to Vietnam to share their expertise. Speaking of overseas visitors, I had the pleasure of hosting senior officials from the Ministry of Education of Singapore in May to explore staff collaboration opportunities with OBV; we are working towards piloting an overseas staff attachment programme.

Our emphasis on staff training showed no signs of abating as our instructional staff continued to deepen their expertise and skills to remain competent in the outdoors. 2 of our instructors completed a demanding 21-day programme at Outward Bound Singapore, which stretched them to their limits! We conducted a Kayaking Ground Deployment Exercise (GDX) to test our emergency response and rescue systems at OBV. All staff also undertook an Open-water Rescue course to build up their water and rescue capabilities. We are proud to have piloted our first Instructor Selection Programme (ISP) at OBV to select a new batch of instructor trainees. I am also excited to introduce our new Senior Manager of Safety and Risk Management at OBV – find out who he is and read about his impressive background! Finally, we are saying farewell to our three interns from Republic Polytechnic after their exciting 5-month internship with OBV.

It has been a fast-paced and breathless quarter! I hope you enjoy reading the second edition of our newsletter.

We are excited to share with you some updates on our recent staff training initiatives in OBV Binh Dinh that took place from May to July. These intensive sessions focused on sharpening our instructors' technical skills in kayaking, outdoor rock climbing, outdoor abseiling, and indoor wall climbing. Our goal was twofold: to refresh the skills of our experienced instructors and to elevate the skills of our new generation of instructors. We are also proud to update that our instructors at both basecamps achieved the Open Water Rescue certification. This certification is a crucial requirement for leading water-based activities at OBV. It ensures that our team is well prepared with the necessary knowledge and skills to handle water-based challenges and uphold the highest safety standards for our participants. We are confident that these advancements in training and certification will enhance the overall quality of our programmes, delivering exceptional and safe Outward Bound experiences for our participants.

Ha Long

With growing interest in water-based activities, the OBV Ha Long team has ramped up its training efforts. Staff participated in kayaking sessions to enhance their skills and familiarize themselves with Sit-On-Top and Sea kayaks. Senior instructors were assessed on group management and site-specific risks. An intensive 3-day training at our kayaking site culminated in a Ground Deployment Exercise (GDX), which focused on evaluating staff competency and emergency management evacuations in managing a mass kayak capsize scenario. The GDX was a major operational exercise following a Table-Top Exercise (TTX) earlier in the year led by our Executive Director and the Operations team at Ha Long. Such ground exercises ensure our risk and crisis management plans are up to date and validated, safety policies are fine-tuned, and our operations team are highly trained to deal with emergency situations - highlighting OBV's commitment in offering safe and impactful programmes in Vietnam.
