### "The Mountains Must Remain Wild"

-Reinhold Messner inspires at the 75th Anniversary of Outward Bound Germany & Austria

A celebration of legacy, vision, and connection to nature - at the end of May, Outward Bound Germany & Austria marked its 75th anniversary with a summit event that honoured its founding mission. Legendary mountaineer and wilderness advocate Reinhold Messner opened the festivities with a moving speech, setting the tone for a day of reflection, adventure, and community.

"The mountains must remain wild," Messner told 170 guests atop Tegelberg Mountain. "And **OUTWARD BOUND** must continue to be a place where people, especially young people, discover their place in nature, in community, and in themselves."

The milestone anniversary event commemorated 75 years since Outward Bound Germany & Austria (OBG) was founded in the postwar period; a time that called for renewed leadership, responsibility, and character in a rising generation. Since then, its programs have empowered thousands to develop confidence, resilience, and a lasting respect for the natural world, values that feel more essential than ever today.

Speaking on behalf of Outward Bound International (OBI), former Chair **David Kong** reflected on the organization's enduring impact: "We're not just creating outdoor programs, we're building the conditions for lifelong transformation. Outward Bound continues to show how challenge and nature together can shape strong, thoughtful, and compassionate individuals."

OBI Executive Director, **lain Peter**, also paid tribute to the strength of OB Germany & Austria programs, and to the leaders who have upheld the mission over the decades.







#### **A Summit Celebration**

Framed by the stunning backdrop of the Bavarian Alps, the celebration included everything from high adrenaline experiences like the Flying Fox zipline to relaxed conversations over mountain coffee. Later that evening, the gathering continued in the heart of OBG's Schwangau Centre with great food, music and stories.

"It was more than a celebration; it was a gathering of our global family," said **Christine Mangold**, Executive Director of OB Germany & Austria.

"To have so many people from around the world here, alumni, colleagues, international leaders, it shows how strong this movement truly is."









### **Celebrating 40 Years of Outward Bound Sabah**

In 1980, a bold vision took root on the shores of Borneo: to bring the transformative power of experiential learning to Sabah. What began as an idea soon grew into Outward Bound Sabah (OBS).

#### **The Early Days**

The story began when the late Datuk Abdul Hamid Bin Tun Datu Haji Mustapha, then Sabah's State Minister of Culture, Youth and Sports, invited Tan Sri Victor Massey Hutson of Outward Bound Malaysia Lumut to explore the potential for a new Outward Bound School in Sabah. A helicopter reconnaissance mission pinpointed Kinarut, just south of Kota Kinabalu, as an ideal location. The site's rich natural features, rivers, beaches, offshore islands, and jungle-covered hills, offered a rare combination of mountain and sea environments, perfect for immersive outdoor learning.

That same year, Tan Sri Hutson crossed paths in London with Squadron Leader (Rtd) Lester Davies, former Warden of Outward Bound Ullswater in the UK. Lester and his wife Anne were invited to visit Sabah. Standing on the Kinarut shoreline, Lester called it

"one of the most beautifully located Outward Bound Schools in the world," and agreed to become the founding warden.



#### Perseverance in the Face of Challenge

Due to administrative delays, Lester and Anne did not officially begin their duties until late 1982. Living modestly and commuting daily to the undeveloped site, they faced enormous obstacles: no roads, no water or electricity, limited funding, and little public awareness of Outward Bound. Construction officially began in February 1983. Soft, sandy soil made building difficult, requiring the import of more stable materials. Swedish prefabricated buildings arrived by May, and gradually, the School began to take shape. Water and electricity would not be fully connected until late 1984.

A key turning point came when the Ministry of Finance granted RM1.9 million, enabling the purchase of essential boats and equipment, including two whalers, *West Wind* and *East Wind*, delivered by the Royal Malaysian Navy.

#### A School Comes to Life

Instructor recruitment and training soon followed. Staff came from across Malaysia and were introduced to the Outward Bound methodology through a 26-day Standard Course, run with staff as participants. OBS officially launched its first public course, "K1," on 2 September 1985.

A major milestone came in 1989, when **His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh** and International Patron of
Outward Bound, visited OBS and formally granted its Charter; a
document that still hangs proudly in the School's admin block
today.

### **Four Decades of Impact**

Since its founding, over 80,000 individuals from Malaysia and around the world have participated in OBS programs, from youth and educators to corporate professionals and government agencies.

At the helm for nearly four decades has been Yang Mulia Dato' Seri Tengku Dr. Adlin bin Tengku Mahamood, whose leadership since 1988 is the longest continuous tenure in the global Outward Bound network. OBS continues to operate under the guidance of a dedicated board of trustees. Its programs remain inclusive and accessible, welcoming people of all backgrounds, abilities, and walks of life.



### Honouring the Journey

As OBS celebrates its 40th anniversary, we honour not only the founders and early staff who brought the School to life, but also the thousands of individuals whose lives have been shaped by its courses.

The story of Outward Bound Sabah is one of belief, in people, in perseverance, in nature, and in the enduring power of challenge to awaken human potential.

# Outward Bound Brasil at 25: Celebrating Journeys that Transform Lives

In 2025, Outward Bound Brasil (OBB) celebrates 25 years of transforming lives through experiential learning in nature.

Since our founding in 2000, we have worked across biomes, regions, and realities in Brazil to bring the impact of Outward Bound to more than 25,000 individuals; always with the belief that challenge and self-discovery in nature are powerful tools for human development.

From the lush Atlantic Forest to the rugged Cerrado, from urban youth at risk to corporate leaders, our programs reflect the country's complexity and potential. # **Celebrating 20 Years of Purposeful Adventure: Outward Bound Croatia**

This year, Outward Bound Croatia (OBC) proudly celebrates 20 years of empowering young people through outdoor learning, community engagement, and experiential education.

#### A Journey of Passion and Persistence

Outward Bound Croatia was formally established as a non-profit, non-governmental association in 2005. Its early years were shaped by the extraordinary commitment of volunteers—most notably Founder Vladimir Dado Mesarić—and a small group of passionate advocates who worked tirelessly to introduce the Outward Bound approach to non-formal education across Croatia, engaging parents, educators, decision-makers, and young people alike.

A key milestone came in 2016, with the opening of the School's first Educational Center in Velikom Žitniku, greatly enhancing its capacity to deliver high-quality, immersive outdoor programs. That same year, under the leadership of **Executive Director Lovorka Šimunec**, Outward Bound Croatia became a fully licensed member of the global Outward Bound network; a significant recognition of its commitment to excellence, impact, and alignment with international standards.

#### **Two Decades of Growth and Impact**

From its early roots, Outward Bound Croatia embraced volunteering and collaboration, grounded in the international Outward Bound philosophy. Programs have always focused on cultivating courage, resilience, empathy, and service, connecting young people with Croatia's forests, rivers, mountains, lakes, and coastline. Today, the School is a recognized leader in experiential learning and one of Croatia's leading NGOs. Outward Bound Croatia runs a combination of programs funded by the European Union as well as social and open enrollment programs for local youth. Funding is often from grants and allows OBC to serve approximately 1200 youth (ages 12-25) annually.



### **Looking Ahead**

As Outward Bound Croatia steps into its next decade, the team is committed to thoughtful, sustainable growth; developing new programs for specific social groups and expanding its dedicated team while staying true to its values of quality, inclusion, and service.

The 20th anniversary will be celebrated this October with a series of events, including a local school program, outdoor activities, and a gathering for staff, board members, families, and partners. It's a heartfelt opportunity to thank the community and reflect on two decades of transformative work.



# Staff Spotlight: Grace Koh, Outward Bound Singapore


### NOT just the data person!

At Outward Bound Singapore (OBS), Grace Koh likes to call herself "just the data person." **However, in reality, she's much more than that!** Working as part of the Program Development Team, she's the one behind the scenes ensuring that outdoor adventure education is more than just fun and games.

Her mission? To ground the excitement of OBS programmes in solid research and evidence-based practices. Numbers, words, and even statistical equations are her tools of choice, helping to strengthen OBS's approach to outdoor education.

Grace has been with OBS for five years now; time she says has flown by. Surrounded by seasoned outdoor educators and youth development veterans, she sometimes still feels like the "new kid on the block." But what sets her apart is her ability to merge a data-driven mindset with a passion for youth development.

"It's like being the backstage producer of a show," she explains, "supporting positive change with spreadsheets, codes, and dashboards as my production tools."



Grace's work involves analyzing participant feedback to improve programmes. She also collaborates with professors and colleagues on research into adapting to climate change, enhancing participant experiences, and advancing sustainability education.

Looking ahead, Grace is excited about two milestones: the opening of OBS's new Coney Campus and welcoming colleagues from around the world to Singapore for the OBI World Conference in 2026.
Grace's contributions also extend beyond Singapore. Within the global network, she is known as something of a "Power BI dashboard whisperer," helping OBI and other Outward Bound Schools clean up their OBOS data and troubleshoot dashboard challenges.

"Power BI and data are not just tools for me," she says. "They are my faithful companions in making the Outward Bound world a better place."

# Leadership Update

## Introducing - Stephen Streufert, Executive Director, Outward Bound California

Stephen comes to Outward Bound California (OBCA) with more than 30 years of nonprofit leadership experience and a lifelong passion for connecting people to the outdoors.

His Outward Bound journey began in the 1980s at the North Carolina Outward Bound School (NCOBS) where he started as a cook. However, the base camp was relieved when he swapped frying pan and ladle for a climbing rack and canoe paddle, moving into the field to lead courses!

The rivers, rocks, and trails of the Appalachians shaped his leadership style and inspired a decade of service with Outward Bound, along with wilderness adventures through the National Outdoor Leadership School (NOLS) in wilderness stretching from the Brooks Range in Alaska to the Everglades.



"I believe the magic of Outward Bound lies in that moment when someone realizes they are capable of more than they ever imagined," Stephen says. "California's wild landscapes of the High Sierras and Joshua Tree, along with vibrant cities, offer endless opportunities for these moments, and I'm honored to help guide the next generation of students toward them."

Throughout his career, Stephen has led organizations focused on youth development, science education, and maritime learning, always emphasizing access, personal growth, and **austheadistrative has riecluded** serving as Executive Director of Salish Sea Expeditions, Vice President of Education at NatureBridge, overseeing programs for 35,000 students in six National Parks, and leading development efforts for the Northwest Maritime Center, including the launch of Maritime High School in Semotile curious about how to pronounce Streufert...the "eu" rhymes with "boy" or "toy" (think Str - oy - fert).

### Full License Status for Outward Bound Kingdom of Saudi Arabia!

"This has been a long journey, but I have every confidence that OBKSA will go on to make a real difference in the Kingdom," said Iain Peter, former Executive Director of Outward Bound International, upon signing the Full License agreement with Outward Bound Global.

# The Outward Bound International Emerging Leaders Program

This year, Outward Bound International is taking the important step to invest in our future leaders with the launch of the **Emerging Leaders Program.** Designed for both field and non-field staff stepping into or aspiring to management roles, the program helps turn people who are already "legends" in their current jobs into leaders with a strong foundation in management. It's about giving talented staff the skills, knowledge, and confidence to use their existing strengths in bigger ways.

Developed in partnership with Penn State University, the six-month online program offers four bite-sized modules covering essential areas like leadership, business and finance, facilities, health and safety, operations, and people management, all taught the Outward Bound way.



Participants will learn from seasoned Outward Bound experts, apply their learning to real workplace projects, and build a global peer network of colleagues in similar roles across our Schools. The program's capstone project will give each participant the opportunity to make a tangible contribution to their home School.

# Templeton Global Research Project Update JOHN TEMPLETON FOUNDATION


Our global research team is in the final phase of the three - year project exploring Character Development in Outward Bound programs.

At the end of September, we will be meeting with Executive Directors from across the network to share with them our findings and also to share resources and materials to assist OB Schools in cultivating character through programming. These resources will be available to the network through the OBI Resource Centre, and to external audiences through the OBI website.

The overall goal of the Templeton Research Project is to engage the OB Global Network in an effort to examine how programming has been adapted to promote character across different cultures.



In addition, over the next 12 months, the team will be rolling out a series of informational webinars focused on our key findings, for members of the OB global community.

Finally, over the coming year, the research team will be consolidating the study and sharing our findings through published articles and presentations at leading conferences worldwide, with the journey culminating at the **OBI World Conference in Singapore in October 2026.**

# **OBI Risk Management Update**

2025 is a busy year for Risk Management Reviews (RMRs) with 26 reviews taking place over the year. Recent risk management reviews have taken place in Canada, the UK, Singapore, the Czech Republic, Indonesia and Brazil. These reviews focus on Whole-of-School risk management, engaging with Boards, management and operations, to look at financial, reputational, legal and safety risks across all levels of the School.





### **Precautionary Vigilance, by Iain Peter**

At Outward Bound, everyone is busy. Instructors and members of the leadership team all have their priorities and key tasks. Staff are super focussed on delivering the best programs and activity sessions.

During OBI Risk Management Reviews, I often have had the chance to observe instructors at work. They do a great job and participants are always safe. However, I am always surprised that I see things that they don't see.

This might be because I am looking at the "whole picture" and not just the knot, belay or personal flotation device. It might be because I have spent many years looking at systems and checking that they are effective. Most likely it because I have developed "PRECAUTIONARY VIGILANCE."



## What is that I hear you ask? It is an awareness of everything that is going on in your vicinity.

Try to confirm by looking around and ensuring that:

- Everything is being done in line with agreed operating procedures
- Your colleagues are in the right place and doing the right things
- Equipment is being used correctly
- There are no hazards that haven't been identified
- Operating areas are tidy and well organised

### **Consideration for Practice:**

- 1. If you see something unusual speak to a colleague. **Don't ignore it.**
- 2. Many of us are familiar with public transport announcements that encourage us to "See it, Say it, Fix it." Try to build this into your normal operating routines.
- 3. Check everything and continue to check and recheck throughout the activity. Don't check at the start of the day check every time you get the chance and always before a participant leaves the ground or gets on the water.
